UNIONIST MEETINGS IN CLENMORISTON. DR A. D. MACEDINON, C.M.G., the prospective Unionist candidate in Inverness-shire, has been visiting Glenmoriston during the present week, meeting with the electors individually, and speaking to them in public assemblies. Mackinnon also addressed a meeting in the readingroom at Invermoriston, at which Mr P. Macdonald, piermaster, occupied the chair.
